- Give up discouragement . . . Be full of hope.
- Give up bitterness . . . Turn to forgiveness.
- Give up hatred . . . Return good for evil.
- Give up anger . . . Practice patience.
- Give up pettiness . . . Put on maturity.
- Give up gloom. . . Enjoy the beauty that is around you.
- Give up jealousy . . . Pray for trust.
- Give up gossiping . . . Control your tongue.
- Give up sin. . . . Turn to virtue.

"Finally, brethren, whatever things are true, whatever things are noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy — meditate on these things" (Philippians 4:8).

UNDER PRESSURE!



I believe it is interesting to note that of two individuals who are under pressure, one might crumble under the stress of the situation, becom-

ing a proverbial lump of goo; yet another might excel, arise to the occasion and conquer the adversity. This contrast seems to be true across a spectrum of human experiences: life, family, career, sports. And when it comes to Christianity, this rule of human nature certainly applies! Nothing is able to put our spiritual well-being to the test more than social pressure. We are social beings – well, we were until the advent of social media, an oxymoron if I've ever seen or heard one and for most of us, we need the company and support of our circle of family and friends – our "tribe." It is unfortunate that not everyone in our circle will be faithful Christians nor even Christian at all, but unbelievers. The late country music singer Joe Diffie (1958-2020) had a hit song way, way back in 1993 entitled "Prop Me Up Beside the Jukebox (If I Die)." The song expresses the sentiment of a good ole country boy who, should he kick the bucket, wants to have his lifeless body posed in the honky tonk that he dearly loves. Even though the song is tongue-in-cheek and is supposed to funny, if we truly stop and think about it, it's anything but humorous. One line in the chorus goes, "Lord I wanna go to Heaven, but I don't wanna go tonight." Sadly, this may very well express the true feelings of many Christians today.

to God. One of the best examples can be seen in our attendance of the worship service. Family and friends will pressure us to join them in weekend activities that pull us away from the church and her worship of almighty God. When we give in to the pressure, we become bad examples to our unbelieving friends. How will they ever be brought to Christ by watching our own unfaithfulness? And don't believe for a second that the devil doesn't enjoy that!

This principle can be applied to all aspects of our spiritual lives. Brethren, instead of giving into social pressures, we must rise to the challenge and remain steadfast, setting the best of examples for those who are outside the body of Christ, "that you may walk properly toward those who are outside, and that you may lack nothing" (1 Thessalonians 4:12).

VARIOUS VERSES FROM MATTHEW & MARK

Matthew 22:34-40 – ³⁴ But when the Pharisees heard that He had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together. ³⁵ Then one of them, a lawyer, asked Him a question, testing Him, and saying, ³⁶ "Teacher, which is the great commandment in the law?" ³⁷ Jesus said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.' ³⁸ This is the first and great commandment. ³⁹ And the second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' ⁴⁰ On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets."

Mark 4:21-25 – ²¹ He said to them, "Do you bring in a lamp to put it under a bowl or a bed? Instead, don't you put it on its stand? ²² For whatever is hidden is meant to be disclosed, and whatever is concealed is meant to be brought out into the open. ²³ If anyone has ears to hear, let them hear." ²⁴ "Consider carefully what you hear," he continued. "With the measure you use, it will be measured to you – and even more. ²⁵ Whoever has will be given more; whoever does not have, even what they have will be taken from them."

Mark 4:26-29 – ²⁶ He also said, "This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man scatters seed on the ground. ²⁷ Night and day, whether he sleeps or gets up, the seed sprouts and grows, though he does not know how. ²⁸ All by itself the soil produces grain–first the stalk, then the head, then the full kernel in the head. ²⁹ As soon as the grain is ripe, he puts the sickle to it, because the harvest has come."
