SPIRITUAL GROWTH — THE TRUTH & THE PAIN – PART 2

As I stated in last week's bulletin, with the new year, I've thought about my spiritual growth (or lack thereof) and in doing some reading I come across Luke 3:9 and wonder what does this verse mean in pratical, everyday terms.

These are the words of John the Baptist: "The ax is already at the root of the trees. Therefore, every tree that doesn't produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire" (Luke 3:9). Note this one phrase: "The ax is laid at the root of the tree."

Last week I stated that my intention was to do three things: First, I want to explain what I believe this verse to be telling us. Second, I want to tell you a story. And third, I want to make a practical application. That's it, the whole article: **one verse**, **one story**, and **an application**.




In continuation of the first part, **THE VERSE**, way back in 19-longlong-time-ago (to use one of Tom's sayings) I lived in Charleston, SC where, though I was single and in the Navy, had bought a house. In the front yard was a Sweet Gum tree. If you're not familiar with Sweet Gums, they tend to be beautiful, symmetrical trees with lovely glossy green five-pointed leaves which turn first gold and then a glorious red in [continued on page 3]

the fall. And my tree the same: A striking, good looking tree with one exception — the seed pods. Oh, those pods! They were green and spiky in the summer hanging from the branches like bright green Christmas ornaments. But then they fade to a hard spiky medium brown color in the fall before dropping to the ground in (what seemed to me) the millions! This of course drew the finches, nuthatches and chickadees who came pressing their small beaks into the Sweet Gum

balls' many chambers, extracting the two small seeds that each chamber contained. And birds, being birds, left me with their "offerings" all over the roof, sidewalks and driveway. Now let me tell you, I found these pods to be one of the greatest threats to mankind I'd ever encountered up to that point in my life (can you say sprained ankles?)! So, I determined that that tree had to go!

I gathered together several of my friends, one of whom had a chainsaw, to take down the evil

tree. Now the tree was about 60 foot tall and was only about 25 feet from the front porch but we somehow managed to not only take it down, but managed to miss all the structures, neighbors yards and the street.

So, the tree had to go, regardless of how pretty it was, and though I considered pruning the tree instead, I knew that branches had a habit of growing back. Not only that, but appearances can be deceiving. Even though the tree looked to be the very picture of health, when the deed was done, the inside was nearly rotted out — it was only a matter of time before the tree might have fallen down on its own in the next strong wind!

You see, the problem with laying the ax (or in my case, the chainsaw) at the root is that it's not easy or quick. You must keep digging. And believe me, trying to dig out the roots of my tree was



so very difficult I finally had to rent a chipper to take it down to below ground. In other words, the work isn't done until the root has been cut off.

If we apply that principle to the spiritual life, we end up with this truth. Spiritual growth is sometimes very painful because you have to get down to the root issues.

THE STORY – This leads me to mention a young man, my age, I met at Dorchester-Waylyn Baptist church when I was living in Charleston.

We started attending about the same time but first, let me set the scene. City churches are quite different from suburban churches and very different from rural churches.

City churches are different because cities are different and Dorchester-Waylyn was smack in the middle of Charleston and pretty much equidistant between the Naval base, the Weapons base, the Coast Guard base and the Air Force base. There were also several colleges and universi-

ties scattered around Charleston, from the Citadel (a premier military school) to Charleston University to Charleston Southern University to Charleston School of Law to the other 10 universities and colleges.

In my four years there, I found out that Dorchester-Waylyn was a "transient" church. If you're not familiar with a military and higher education city where there are multiple universities and military bases, let me tell you, there's a lot of turnover. There were many, many young people (like me) who came for awhile for a multiplicity of reasons: jobs, school, military or just to be with their friends. Dorchester-Waylyn had hundreds of people who came and went every year. That's something I hadn't experienced in my young life to that point. In one year alone I remember the con-[continued on page 6]

gregation reporting that there'd been over 300 people coming and going. The takeaway: No one stays forever. In that same report, the congregation had figured out that the average young person stayed in church about 18 months so, yes, I was the exception, staying there a whole four years before moving back to Texas. That meant that Dorchester-Waylyn was a "one-stop-shop" like those corner gas stations that double as grocery stores.

No one stayed in the church forever. People would show up, stay a while, and then leave.

Back to the friend I made while attending. He came to Dorchester-Waylyn claiming he had come from a Christian home and that he knew Jesus. And he had a story to tell. You see, somewhere along the way he'd made a wrong turn into sexual sin. As a result, he contracted a disease that might one day take his life. I knew that much because he was open about his past.

He hung around for a year, made some friends (like me), got involved, and then disappeared. And that was fairly typical.

During that year we talked about many things and one day, as we talked about life in general, I asked what he'd learned on his journey thus far. He told me, "Mitch, you've got to lay the ax at the root of the tree." I didn't know what he meant, so I asked him to explain. He shared what he had learned through hard experience. When dealing with entrenched sin, you can't chop at the leaves or try to hack off the branches. You've got to get down to the root. "But that hurts too much for most people," he said. "Believe me, I know."

At that time I vaguely realized he was quoting the Bible when he told me that, but I didn't know the reference. His comment has stayed buried in my memories for just shy of 30 years. And then it came back to me when I was researching this article and recalled the issue with my Sweet Gum tree.


