# COMMEND, GREET AND WATCH OUT! - PART 3

co-ministers

MITCH WATKINS, BASED ON A SERMON BY STEVE SHEPHERD, CAPE GIRARDEAU, MO In part one, we looked at Romans 16:1-2 in which Paul wishes the Romans, and by extension us, to COMMEND ONE ANOTHER because without such, young people will wilt, marriages may dissolve, employees will wither, leaders become jaded and uncaring, hope dies, and depression and suicide can run rampant. In other words, people die for lack of praise – perhaps not physically but certainly spiritually – and maybe not all at once but certainly a bit at a time. In part two we looked at verses 3-5a of Romans 16. In these verses Paul indicates we need to GREET ALL WHO ARE IN CHRIST. We must be quick to greet, speak, and encourage all the peoples in the church. How we treat each other matters because it shows those not yet in Christ how much we love one another (John 15:9-17).

In this final part, we're going to look at verses 17-18 of Romans 16 where we're told, in no uncertain words: WE MUST WATCH OUT FOR THOSE WHO CAUSE TROUBLE. ("<sup>17</sup>Now I urge you, brethren, note those who cause divisions and offenses, contrary to the doctrine which you learned, and avoid them. <sup>18</sup> For those who are such do not serve our Lord Jesus Christ, but their own belly, and by smooth words and flattering speech deceive the hearts of the simple").

When Clyde R. Hoey was governor of North Carolina (1947-51), he visited the far western part of his state and met a country preacher. The usual question about how many members there were in the congregation brought the response "Fifty." When the Governor asked, "How many of them are active?" the preacher said, "They're all active." "My," his excellency, the right honorable Hoey remarked, "You must be an unusual preacher and most excellent orator to have a 100 percent active membership." "Well" the preacher admitted, "Twenty-five are active for me and twenty-five are active against me."

If you ever been in a congregation, or know of one personally, which is split over anything or

anyone you know that there will be division and trouble. I've never understood why people don't seem to comprehend that we all need to work toward agreement and accord. Notice I said, "work toward" because make no mistake, it is work. But even though we may disagree, we must learn to disagree without becoming disagreeable (I think there's a lesson for congress there).

Recall the words of Psalm 133:1: "<sup>1</sup>Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity!" Paul reminds us of that same thing in a few places. Romans 14:19 says, "<sup>19</sup> Therefore let us pursue the things which make for peace and the things by which one may edify another." And Ephesians 4:31-32 commands us to "<sup>31</sup>Let all bitterness, wrath, anger, clamor [loud quarreling], and evil speaking be put away from you, with all malice. <sup>32</sup>And be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God in Christ forgave you."

In watching out for those who cause trouble, remember verse 17 of Romans from a few paragraphs above: "<sup>17</sup>Now I urge you, brethren, note those who cause divisions and offenses, contrary to the doctrine which you learned, and avoid



"Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravenous wolves." — Matthew 7:15

them."

In the following cautionary tale we're reminded of that very thing: A preacher was going over the church's finances and found a receipt from a local paint store signed by someone named Christian. He wasn't aware of anyone buying paint, so he called the store to point our its mistake telling the manager, "I'm sorry, but there are no Christians here at (church name withheld to protect the innocent)."

You know, sometimes there are church members who act like they are not Christian. And some of those seem to be interested only in causing division or trouble in a congregation.

There's a list I found of ways to split your church:

1. Focus only on your desires.

2. Listen to every criticism you hear.

3. Focus on your preacher's weaknesses, not his strengths. Target his imperfections and shortcomings for constant criticism to undermine morale.

4. Speak the truth or practice love, but never combine the two.

5. Store grievances for future use.

- 6. Forgive only those who ask you to do so, and only if they deserve it. Placing conditions on your forgiveness is a sure-fire way to kill love between believers.
- 7. Hide your own sins behind harsh attitudes. Denounce others for sins you secretly struggle with.
- 8. Do whatever you have to do to win. Twist Scripture out of context to justify your view and methods.
- 9. Tell others that you are on a mission from God. Avoid accountability and verification to help you dissolve Christian unity.

Obviously, these things are just the opposite of what we've supposed to do. And doing these things will only cause more disagreement and di-[continued on page 6]

vision in the church. We're reminded in Proverbs 26:20: "<sup>20</sup> Where there is no wood, the fire goes out; and where there is no talebearer [gossiper or slanderer], strife ceases." We must never put more wood on fires in the church. Instead, we must try to put them out and often, the best way is not talking about them. The lesson? Stay away from troublemakers and keep from causing more trouble. Be a problem-solver, not a troublemaker.



So, in love we must, according to Paul's letter to the Romans: (1) commend/praise people, (2) greet all who are in Christ, and (3) watch out for those who cause trouble because Galatians 5:13 tells us: "<sup>13</sup> For you, brethren, have been called to liberty; only do not use liberty as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another." Brethren, we ALL have a ministry of love to perform. May we all be willing to do such!

<sup>7</sup> Let the sea roar, and all its fullness, the world and those who dwell in it; <sup>8</sup> Let the rivers clap their hands; let the hills be joyful together <sup>9</sup> before the Lord, for He is coming to judge the earth. With righteousness He shall judge the world, and the peoples with equity.

– Psalm 98:7-9
