How Does Understanding Culture Help Us Fulfill The Great Commission?

We can't escape culture. We can't. Culture has been compared to the air we walk through and that we breathe every day. If that is so, what is the best way to interact with culture as we attempt to fulfill the Great Commission?

And why would this be important? Well, it's important because as we seek to fulfill our mission, culture is the medium of mission. That means a culture-less mission is not possible. Like any message, Gospel proclamation requires a language of transmission — a verbal language, yes, but also a written language, a body language and a societal language. Culture is the very language of life, whether one is a missionary in Africa or eastern Europe, or one is just a regular church member in Lytle. Every single one of us navigates culture in our daily life. The question then becomes, "Are we doing it well?"

As Christians, we have a responsibility to understand culture and how it works, in order that we can contextualize the Gospel. Contextualization is just a big, fancy-speak [continued on page 3]

word for the process of adapting a message to a particular culture (or context) so people in that culture are able to understand it. Now, this is an important task for a church that has been told to make disciples of all nations, all groups, all tribes, all kin, all bands, all cultures. That means understanding culture is important because sharing the Gospel with people is important.

Everyone has a culture. You have one. I have one. We all have one. Everybody sees the world through a particular lens.

In other words, everyone has a worldview and exists as part of a particular culture. Our worldview is the foundation of our belief system and impacts how we understand everything around us. Culture is, in one sense, one's worldview come to life as people create language, art, tools, and even social norms. These products of culture then circle back to reinforce or if necessary, adjust a person's worldview. In this way, it is our culture that gives shape to our world and allows us to take in new information and make sense of it.

Unfortunately, like all of creation, culture is marred by the fall. That means everyone's view of the world is really and truly incomplete and twisted. Yes, everyone's! This is where the proclamation of the Gospel becomes central to the Great Commission. The Gospel transforms viewpoint. Once we are redeemed, our worldview is increasingly transformed into a Biblical view, which results in the creation of God-honoring culture and the discernment to reject any culture that does

not honor God. That doesn't mean we shouldn't make an attempt to redeem any Godless culture we run across. Instead, we must remember we are called to proclaim the Gospel to cultures in a way and manner that those who are a part of those cultures can understand.

Brethren, culture runs deep. It is exactly like an iceberg with much more under the surface than above. Understanding this truth is important for two reasons.



First, Christians need to actively learn the culture of others. We should seek to understand how people think, what they feel and

how they see the world. This is especially true for local churches in North America that now find themselves living next to Muslims, Buddhists, Hindus and scores of other groups, even Catholics and Baptists. Our neighbors are increasingly different than us, and it is our Gospel responsibility to understand them so we can clearly communicate the Good News of Christ.

Second, culture runs very deep in individuals. Our culture subtly influences our foundational beliefs about life, family, faith and society. Often, we are unaware of how much this affects the way we communicate with others — including how we communicate the Gospel.

So, you may be asking yourself, "Mitch, if our culture so affects our communication, how will the Gospel make sense to our neighbors who are different than us?"

Senior professor Sherwood G. Lingenfelter¹ made a claim about culture that may help us understand how we can make sense of the contextu

al difficulties in sharing the Gospel. He claimed that culture is a palace and a prison — simultane-



ously. He said, "Culture is a palace when there are no other contesting voices around us, when we can live fairly comfortable, ordered lives in the context of our own cultural system. When everyone in the room thinks the same way, that room can feel pretty comfortable. Shared culture reinforces our views, and it allows us to pat ourselves on the back for feeling the way we do. In this regard, culture is a palace that makes us confident and comfortable in our views."

This aspect of culture is not always bad. This experience of feeling reinforced is why time with family is meaningful (most of the time) or why we love going to football games with thousands of other people cheering on our team. It's exactly why we might think that southern food is the best food, and going home to, say Tennessee or Mississippi or North Carolina is a joy (again, most of the time). This reinforcement produces a sense of identity, and it solidifies the values our culture expects.

Lingenfelter continues: "However, when we are pushed into relationships that are outside the boundaries of our culture, that culture becomes a prison to us. We are blind to other ways of seeing and doing things, and we assume that our way is the only way that is appropriate and best. So, we become frustrated and angry with those who insist on breaking our rules, and we attempt to enforce our rules on them. When no one in the room thinks the same way as us, we experience something altogether different. Culture, in this sense starts to feel like a prison. When everything around us is from a different culture, we cease to understand what is happening. The symbols, the

communications, the values, and the way of life all have different meaning. We are trapped in our inability to communicate effectively. In this experience, we assume certain "bedrock truths" only to discover that everyone else disagrees. When we are ignorant of the walls created by culture, we fail to communicate across them effectively."

Again, you may be wondering why it matters.

First, we should realize that we are bound by our culture. Our way of viewing the world colors our understanding of everything around us which means we have blind spots, and knowing that should change how we approach the most important things in our life as a Christ follower. So, let's try to peel back the curtain on our culture. Are there any unbiblical presuppositions from our culture that's influencing our wordlview?

Second, see our need to understand other cultures. Local churches in North America should take seriously the unprecedented opportunity to do cross-cultural ministry in our own communities. Do you have a neighbor from a different faith tradition, or someone from a different country of origin? These people need to know the Gospel, and perhaps God placed them there so you can share it with them. To do that, we must get [continued on page 8]

better at learning other cultures. Only when we understand their culture can we communicate appropriately and bridge the cultural barrier.

As some people may wonder if I'm rejecting absolute truth when I speak of contextualization, I'd like to set the record straight — No. I do **not** reject the concept of absolute truth — Nope. Nada. Not at all. Just because people see truths differently does not mean truths do not exist.

The Gospel is true for every culture. The words of God to man stand as words for every people in every place and in every time, until Jesus returns for His own. The salvation offered by Christ is the **exclusive means** of restored relationship with our Heavenly Father, regardless of one's background. The Gospel never changes. But how we communicate the Gospel might. Every message has a medium through which it passes. The Gospel is always passed to people in cultural forms, so we must be sure that we are passing it on well. Our goal is to share an unchanging Gospel in a way people can understand!
